General Meeting Minutes –3/17/2021

President Carolyn Watts called the business meeting to order at 7:20 pm.

There were some new people in attendance, so we each briefly introduced ourselves.

The minutes from the October General Meeting were reviewed. Carolyn motioned to accept those minutes as read. Pam seconded. The motion passed on a voice vote.

Treasurer Rocky Redford presented the treasurer's report. Pam motioned to accept the treasurer's report as read. Fred seconded. The motion passed on a voice vote.

The TVOS board audited the treasurer's books tonight. The audit was successful.

The 2022 TVOS Orchid Show and Sale will be held on April 23 & 24, with set-up on Friday, Apr. 22, at the Hilton Garden Inn in Boise. We will have AOS judges. Several vendors have indicated that they will participate. Those are Emerald City Orchids and Patti Young with an artist friend. Other potential vendors are Gem State Carnivores and Jolah Orchids. The theme of the 2022 show is "Orchid Fever." Chris Thomas is updating the show advertisement.

The December 2021 Annual Meeting and potluck will be held at the Saints Constantine & Helen Greek Orthodox Church, 2618 W. Bannock Street in Boise. Set-up is at 6 pm. We will be meeting in the basement where the dining room and kitchen are located. The club will provide place settings. Pam will bring a ham. Everyone is invited to bring a guest and a dish to share.

Elections will be held for board positions at that meeting. Anyone interested in becoming a board member is welcome. Just speak to a current board member.

Gregg Mattson motioned to adjourn the business meeting. Fred seconded. The motion passed on a voice vote.

The program tonight is on growing miniature orchids and ideas to increase humidity for orchids. Sufficient humidity is a challenge in Idaho's very dry climate.

Our new member, Sharee Wright grows miniature orchids. Gregg Mattson helped with the presentation. Gregg works at North End Organic Nursery and has been bringing in orchids for sale. There are some miniatures in stock now.

Sharee brought in examples of the containers she makes from plastic water bottles for her miniatures. Her method helps with humidity for each orchid. She likes to grow Australian orchids because they need to dry out between waterings.

Gregg also grows miniature orchids. He mists his twice every morning about 15 minutes apart, uses humidity trays and a fan. Gregg brought in samples of material that can be used to mount miniature orchids. Some sources for miniatures are: Orchids by Hausermann, Andy's Orchids on a Stick, and Orchid Dynasty. Sharee will bring in a list of miniatures she thinks would be good for beginners.

More ideas for increasing humidity were a home-made fogger, a terrarium, semi-hydro, misting devices and humidity trays.

We discussed the Orchid Grow-Out Project. Carolyn brought half of the seedlings that have been de-flasked and repotted into Slurpee cups with their lids. The seedlings need to remain in those cups for about a year. After that, they can be repotted into new medium.

There are 3 sizes: large, medium and small seedlings. Grow-out instructions were given out. The seedlings are a new compact cattleya hybrid from Carter and Holmes. Half of the potted seedlings were sold at this meeting. The other half will be available at the December meeting.
