TREASURE VALLEY ORCHID SOCIETY, INC. Boise, ID General Meeting Minutes – 9/15/2021

This is the club's first in-person General Meeting at its new meeting location (King of Glory Lutheran Church in Boise.)

President Carolyn Watts called the meeting to order at 7:10 p.m., with 13 club members in attendance, including one virtually. The last General Meeting was in March, so it was informally decided not to approve or amend those minutes.

Treasurer Rocky Redford reported the club's bank balance, and said the club made about \$325 from last month's silent auction of plants and supplies at the annual potluck picnic. No motion was made in regard to the Treasurer's Report.

OLD BUSINESS: We briefly discussed the 2022 TVOS Orchid Show & Sale, which is scheduled for April 23-24, 2022 at the Hilton Garden Inn in Boise. Carolyn said she's contacted the American Orchid Society Judging Center, and we should have four judges coming for the show.

MONTHLY MEETING TOPIC: Tammy Dana discussed her use of New Zealand tree-fern fiber for repotting. She brought several plants that are doing well in this medium, and also repotted some at the meeting. Tammy says *Miltoniopsis*, *Bulbophyllum* and *Oncidium* orchids do well in tree-fern fiber, or any orchid that likes to stay somewhat moist. It's not as good for phrags or paphs, and should not be mixed with other potting materials. Tammy gave samples to the club members in attendance, who are now keen to give it a try.

There was one raffle prize and two door prizes, but the winners' names were not recorded. The "show table" contained 19 beautiful blooming orchids, which everyone voted on. However, the meeting ended and people took their plants home before the vote results were tabulated. (We're all out of practice with in-person meetings!) So, here's what we know about the results:

First place - #17, grown by Terry McMorrow Second place - #4, grown by Donna Groth Third place - #2

Thanks also to Pam Spencer, who made delicious gingerbread and brought apple cider for the group to enjoy, along with Terry McMorrow's coffee. The meeting adjourned around 8:30 p.m.
